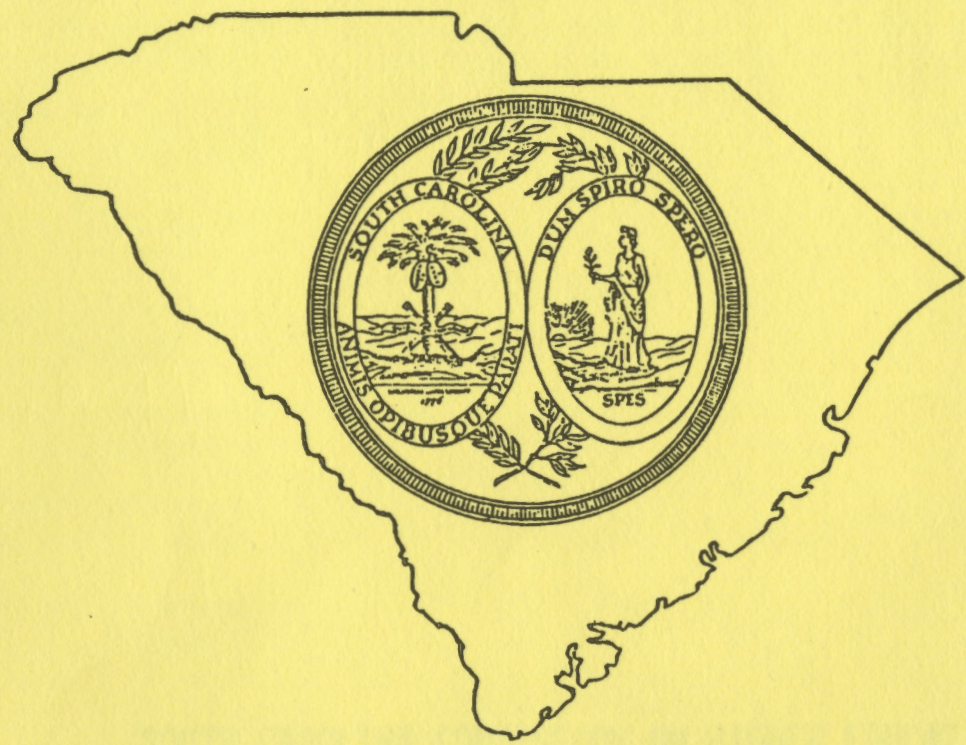

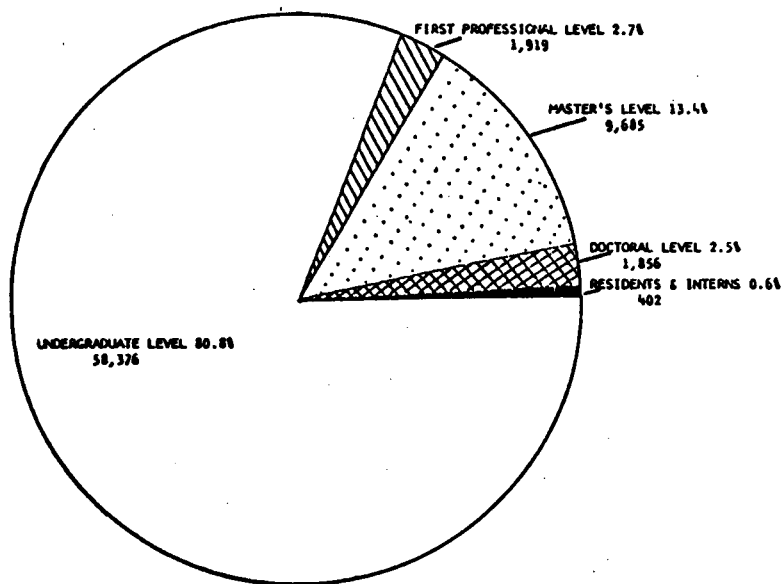
## FOREWORD

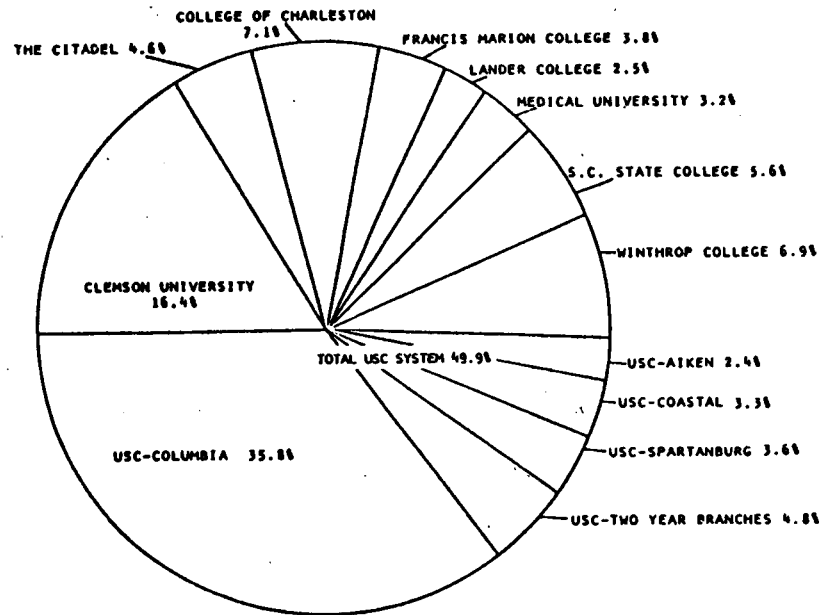

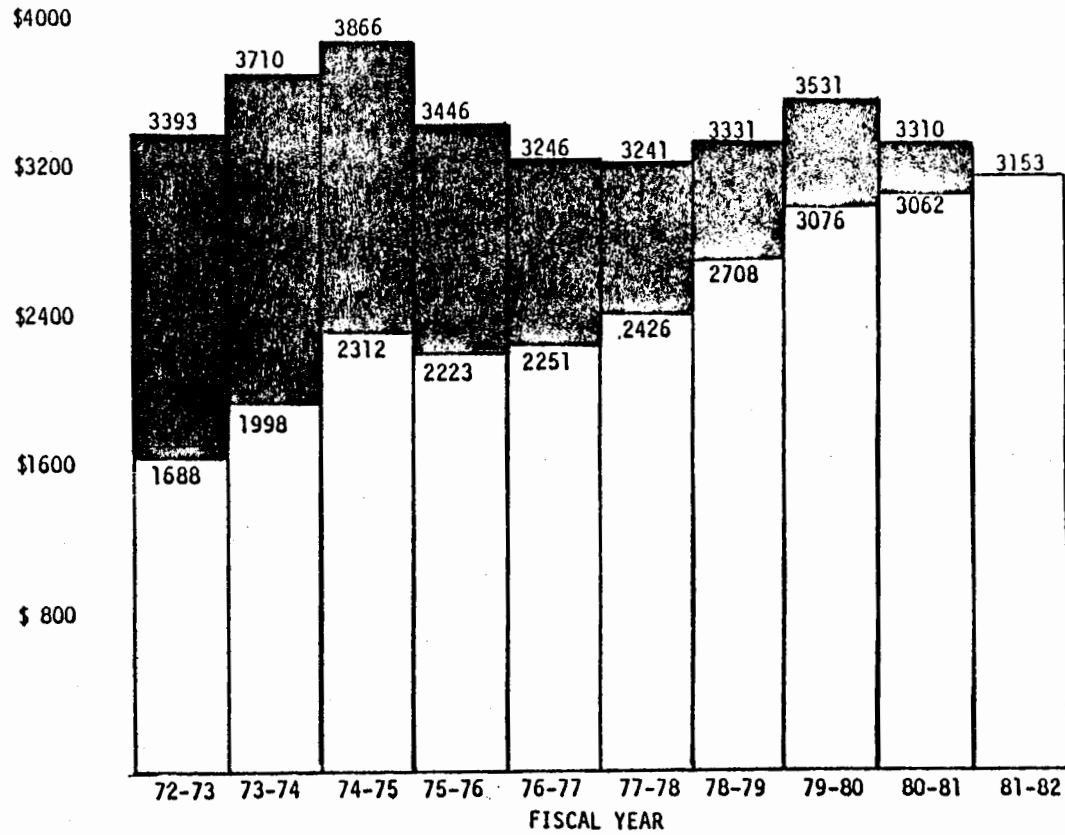
