A special two-hour program to assist students and parents in looking for ways to pay for a college education aired January 31 on all ETV channels. Many high schools taped this program to have it on hand in the guidance office. The repeat broadcasts are NOT interactive with call-in questions, but the information is still useful to students and parents trying to find money for higher education.

Produced by the State Department of Education’s ITV team, **Finding Money for College** features financial aid professionals from public and private colleges and universities in South Carolina. In addition, guidance counselors offer advice and representatives from the South Carolina Higher Education Tuition Grants, South Carolina Student Loan Corporation and South Carolina Commission on Higher Education answer questions on accessing scholarships, grants and loans.

In addition to providing key information, this year’s program features a special segment on high school guidance services to help students find financial help for college that was taped at **Walhalla High School in Oconee School District**. Also, these students give their peers advice about what can help them in the process. Congratulations to the Walhalla Razorbacks for being selected as our feature school this year on **Finding Money for College!**

This information is very timely and especially needed for seniors, but valuable for juniors to plan ahead. Please tape this NEW program for your high school guidance counselors if you did not tape it in January.

- 3) Artwork **MUST have completed submission form attached to the back.** (This form can be found in the packet posted on the ITV Web site and on the last page of this publication.)
- 4) All submissions **must be postmarked by April 6, 2010** deadline.

NEW Lessons in Idella Bodie's SC Women Series Tape Ahead for Women's History Month!

(ALL with unlimited rights) The teacher's guide is being updated to include new lessons!

Produced by ITV and ETV and directed by ETV's Pat Henry, the stories in this NEW series are being adapted with permission and input from author Idella Bodie. They are dramatizations of the stories from her book *South Carolina Women*. Recommended to support social studies standards for South Carolina history for elementary and middle grade students, the programs are also good for use during Women's History Month with students in grades 3–12. Each dramatization tells the story of women who have shaped South Carolina history and politics. And, the stories have been produced at historical sites and homes. These two additional lessons on **Modjeska Simkins** and **Mary Gordon Ellis** show how each woman dealt with the issue of equality.

Program Seven (NEW) – Modjeska Simkins

This is the story of an African American girl born to a half-white, half-black brick mason who came from relative wealth and married into wealth, but she dedicated her life to helping the disadvantaged to be treated equally. She was one of the organizers of the Supreme Court Case Briggs Vs. Elliott, which was the first filed of the four cases that later became combined Brown vs. Board of Education.

Program Eight (NEW) – Mary Gordon Ellis

Mary Gordon Ellis was the first female to be elected to the South Carolina Legislature. This drama depicts her life from the challenges of being the school superintendent of Jasper County Schools where she made bold changes to impact education to her time in office as an elected official until her untimely death at an early age.

Other Programs in the Series:

Program One - Grace and Rachel Martin

This is the story of two sisters-in-law living alone in the South Carolina back country who waylaid a British Courier with valuable papers by dressing up as colonial men. They risked their lives to stop the flow of information. Taped on location with historical costumes and artifacts, it takes place in the cabin considered to be the oldest frontier house still standing in SC.

Program Two – Emily Geiger

Emily is a young girl who risked her life by serving as a messenger for the Colonial army during the Revolutionary War. Captured by the British and interrogated as a spy, she managed to trick Lord Rawdon into believing she was innocent, outwitting her captors in a most unique manner. Taped in part at the actual location where the interrogation took place, this drama covers the story of Emily's journey from her assignment with General Greene to her release by Lord Rawdon.

Program Three - Mary Chesnut

Mary kept a diary during the turbulent times of the Civil War. This drama portrays various events in the life of the South Carolina heroine prior to and during the Civil War. The events dramatized are actual happenings that occurred to Mary and most of the words come straight from her diary. Mary actually spent time at Kensington Plantation, the location of the drama.

Program Four - The Grimké Sisters

Sarah Moore Grimké (1792-1873) and Angelina Emily Grimké (1805-1879), followed a similar path, speaking out about what they believed and leaving their home to join the fight for the causes of the abolition of slavery and equal rights for women. Today women are leaders in the community and in the business world, working along side their male counterparts in voicing and making their decisions, but it was not the same in the 1800's. These two South Carolina sisters helped lead the way to change the course of history in both our state and in the United States. We see from a young age how both stood up for what they believed were the wrongs of society. They spoke out against slavery and found the courage to fight for their right as women to have a voice.

Program Five – Wil Lou Gray

Tells the story of Dr. Wil Lou Gray who began the South Carolina Opportunity School. The program follows her from the time that she was a young girl struggling with the loss of her dear mother through Dr. Gray's valiant efforts to get the Legislature to fund schooling for illiterate adults and children. Through reenactment of scenes in her life and interviews taped with Dr. Gray by ETV in the 1980's, we hear in Dr. Gray's own words her passion to help others to learn while we learn about what life was like during the early 1900's for many South Carolinians.

Program Six – Mary McLeod Bethune

This is the story of one woman's struggle to gain equality for herself and her students. The drama begins with Mary as a young child growing up in Mayesville, South Carolina, and concludes with her hard work to start a school for African American students in Florida. Through the scenes we see the struggle that Mary encountered just to be given the chance to learn to read and then to teach others, including being threatened with bodily harm. The drama shows how she started with nothing and ended up being an advisor to a United States President!

The Big Picture, ETV’s news and public affairs series, focused on the topic of wind turbine testing in the January 28th program that aired on ETV. Clemson’s Restoration Institute in Charleston was recently awarded a 45 million dollar grant from the U.S. Department of Energy to build and run a large wind turbine drive train test facility on the former Naval Base. Repeated for schools in the ITV schedule, this program talks about green energy from wind and what it means for our state.

“National Weather Person Day” & TV Series on Weather!

To celebrate “National Weather Person Day,” ITV will repeat **Weather Smart**, a series designed for grades 4–8 that teaches weather principles with key topics that make up an entire course on the wonders of weather! Each program is about fifteen minutes in duration. Titles in order are: *Thunderstorms; Tornadoes; Hurricanes; Climate; Forecasting and Weather Instruments; Heat, Wind and Pressure; The Water Cycle and Clouds; Ozone and Pollution; Winter and Snow; and Weather.* Also available in *StreamlineSC*, each program can stand alone in teaching the facets of meteorology so let your science teachers know it can support their curriculum.

SC Maps Course Video Units Repeat

The **SC Maps** course, facilitated by Clemson University, has ten 90-minute video units that teachers taking the course will need to have recorded for them. DES should make sure they have these programs in case teachers in their areas need them. Under the direction of Clemson University’s Dr. John Wagner, this course offered began in January.

The **Better Kid Care** series provided by The University of Pennsylvania through ITV will not be offering new programs this year due to funding cutbacks. ITV will repeat programs provided in previous years each month so watch for these and access if you do not have these valuable resources. The programs repeated in a block feed this month provide music, science, math, and art ideas for very young children.

A Literary Tour of SC – Eleven NEW Programs Repeat

Repeat block feed Feb. 24, 8:00 a.m.–1:54 p.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights) SL

All eleven NEW programs added to the ITV schedule this school year repeat in February. Hear what these authors with SC connections have to say about making characters come alive. Learn how each creates the plot and keeps track of the action. Find out how important research is to any story, both fiction and non-fiction. Recommended for grades 5–12.

- **William Price Fox** (24 minutes) A popular American novelist who graduated from USC and was a Writer-In-Residence there until 2007, Fox wrote *Southern Fried* and *Doctor Golf*. He tried to make every book different from the one before it. He also wrote for many national magazines.
- **Natalie Dupree** (34 minutes) She is the author of ten best-selling cookbooks and host of 300 TV shows, which have aired on PBS, The Learning Channel and The Food Network. Famous for starting the New Southern Cooking movement now found in restaurants throughout the South.
- **Dinah Johnson** (11 minutes) Born in Charleston, a graduate of Spring Valley High School and resident of Columbia, she wrote several books for children and is a contributor to *In Daddy's Arms I am Tall: African Americans Celebrating Fathers*. She holds a Ph.D. from Yale and teaches at USC.
- **Janette Turner Hospital** (45 minutes) Currently a Professor and Distinguished Writer-In-Residence at USC, she grew up in Queensland and has taught in universities all over the world. She has published six novels, including *The Last Magician* and *Tiger in the Pit*, and three story collections, winning numerous awards. Her work has been translated into twelve languages. (**NOTE:** Program is flagged. She describes how she writes sexual content in a tasteful manner, but please preview before use.)
- **Karen Petit** (35 minutes) A noted author of children's stories, she published her first book for adults in 2008. *A Paw on My Heart* tells the author's true story of how, in the aftermath of a horrendous divorce, she reluctantly acquired a dog for companionship and discovered the amazing healing power of pets.
- **Dori Sanders** (29 minutes) A native of Gilbert, SC, a tiny community in York County, her family operates one of the oldest African-American farms in the region. Her father, a former sharecropper, bought the land around 1915. She has written books about life in our state that reflect her African-American roots.
- **Joyce Hansen** (37 minutes) A former teacher in New York City, she writes contemporary novels, as well as historical fiction, exploring the African-American experience. Her first children's book, *The Gift-Giver*, was inspired by her own Bronx childhood and her students. She taught until 1995 and now lives in South Carolina, writing full time.
- **Kwame Dawes** (39 minutes) Born in Ghana, Dawes grew up in Jamaica. His 11th collection of verse, *Wisteria: Poems From the Swamp Country*, was published in 2006. He is a Distinguished Poet-In-Residence, Professor of Liberal Arts, Founder/Executive Director of the SC Poetry Initiative, and director of the USC Arts Institute.
- **Kate Salley Palmer** (28 minutes) A native of Orangeburg, she started her career while at USC as the cartoonist for *The Gamecock*. Her cartoon strip, *Terrible Tom and the Boys*, caricatured the school's administration during the late 60's in a humorous way. In 1990, she illustrated her first children's picture book, *How Many Feet in the Bed* by Diane Johnston Hamm. She continues to write and present talks to students about political cartooning and/or writing and illustrating children's books.
- **Jack Bass** (21 minutes) Author or co-author of seven nonfiction books about the American South, his works have focused on Southern politics, race relations and the role of law in shaping the civil rights era. He is a professor of Humanities and Social Sciences at the College of Charleston.
- **Marjory Wentworth** (32 minutes) Her poems have appeared in numerous books, magazines and anthologies. *Noticing Eden*, a collection of poems, was published in 2003. Her most recent book is *Despite Gravity* and she is working on a children's book called *Shackles*. She is the Poet Laureate of South Carolina.

It's time to celebrate...Valentine's Day, Presidents' Day and African-American History Month. ITV offers many opportunities to enhance your instructional program during the month of February. Check out the **ITV Resources Book** for a wide variety of programming information.

ETV's Road Trip! Through SC Civil Rights History, recommended for grades 3–12, focuses on the events, places and people who played an important role during the civil rights movement in our state from the 1940's through the early 1970's. *The Road Trip! Mid State* includes the home of Modjeska Simkins and a visit through history to Liberty Hill AME Church. *The Road Trip! Coastal* visits the Penn Center in Beaufort County and

historic Atlantic Beach. *The Road Trip! Upstate* goes to Clemson, Greenville and Greenwood to learn about the Rev. James Hall, Harvey Gantt and the Mt. Pisgah AME Church. **Northward to Freedom** designed for grades 4-10 highlights New York branches of the Underground Railroad through moving narratives and reenactments. Spotlighting the lesser-known routes that led through the Hudson and Champlain Valleys, it celebrates the courage and fortitude of slaves who risked capture and death to escape as well as those sympathetic who assisted them. **The Underground Railroad: Escape from Slavery** examines the institution of slavery from the capture to life on Southern plantations. These programs are available to your school through **ITV** and *StreamlineSC*.

What an exciting time to celebrate Presidents' Day. Take a look at the resources for George Washington. Lesson titles include: *The Life and Times of George Washington*, *Mount Vernon: Home of George Washington* and *Project Discovery Visits Mount Vernon*. *Project Discovery Revisited* has 5 programs of interest for all ages available through **ITV** and *StreamlineSC*. **Citizen Brain Feeding on American Democracy** is a fun, high-energy, content-rich program that engages elementary students to teach facts about our representative democracy using music and graphics along with "real-people" hosts and Citizen Brain, an animated character. The program encourages citizenship and participation in our government. **Facts of Congress** series consists of thirty one-minute animated segments, rich in content to interest students about facts, history and the operations of our Congress for grades 4-9. Both resources are available through **ITV** and *StreamlineSC*.

ITV offers a popular series **Holiday Facts and Fun** geared for students in grades K-5. *Valentine's Day* complete with teacher's guide and correlated to standards can be found through **ITV** and *StreamlineSC*. *The Magic School Bus Gets Charged*, *Timothy Goes to School* and *Ready Set Learn with Paz: A World of Friends* are other fun elementary programs for Valentine's Day. **Deskercise**, a series designed for students to exercise right at their desks, offers theme-based programs for Martin Luther King Day, First Winter Olympics, President's Day and Valentines Day.

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Colonial Williamsburg Electronic Field Trips 2009–10

February 11 Program... The Slave Trade

The CWEFT programs use 21st century technology to enrich the teaching of history and social studies, making the subjects exciting and relevant to today's classrooms. The field trips are correlated to national standards and provide a dramatic and compelling learning experience for 4th and 5th grade students. Though schools may view the programs free and record them with 10-day fair use rights (can tape and use for 10 days from broadcast date, but must erase tape within 45 days), there are definite advantages to paying the fee to Colonial Williamsburg to participate.

By paying the fee to participate, schools get the outstanding teacher materials, get to keep the recorded program for the life of the tape and have access to the re-enactors and historians online and via a toll-free number. Schools pay approximately \$500 per school for all seven programs, but rights for individual programs can be purchased. - Feb. 11, 2010 ***The Slave Trade*** – Beginning with the American Revolution, this program explores the U.S. law of 1807 that abolished the trans-Atlantic slave trade. Meet the people who were involved in or influenced by this pivotal legislation: the slaves, plantation owners, slave-ship captains, common seamen, government officials, Navy officers, and anti-slavery activists.
- Mar. 11, 2010 ***The Rights of Youth (premiere)*** – Imprisonment, whipping, forced transportation, and even death were some of the punishments that courts sentenced children to in the eighteenth century. Witness how justice was administered at a time when criminal laws and sentencing guidelines made few or no exceptions for children.
- Apr. 22, 2010 ***Treasure Keepers*** – You have seen their work in every museum, but what do conservators really do? Learn how conservators prevent or slow the damage caused by “agents of destruction.” Explore how and why preserving history is important for future generations.

RIGHTS REMINDER: SC schools may view the programs with 10-day fair use rights. (Can record, but lesson must be used within ten days and then tape erased or destroyed within 45 days.) ONLY schools that receive a scholarship through ITV for one program OR schools that pay Colonial Williamsburg to participate either in single lessons or in the entire series can keep the copy of the program(s) for the life of the tape, receive the guides, get online access, and have phone interaction with the historians.

The 23rd annual Black History Teleconference will be held live on the campus of Benedict College in Columbia on Wednesday, February 17 at 1:00 pm. The program then airs on ETV February 21 and will be repeated in the ITV schedule as shown above. **The Struggle Continues: The History of Black Economic Empowerment** features six SC high school students and one Benedict College student who will question seven prominent African Americans about their achievements, ideas and challenges in relation to this year's theme. Dr. Marianna White Davis, special assistant to the president of Benedict College, serves as executive producer to develop the program. Of significance this year is the 100th anniversary of the National Urban League, Inc. One of the founders of the League is Dr. Kelly Miller, Sr. (1863–1939), a mathematical genius who was a native of Winnsboro, SC and a long-time professor of mathematics and physics at Howard University.

Dr. David H. Swinton, president of Benedict and the Honorable Otis F. Clopton, Sovereign Grand Commander of the Masons, will introduce the program. Dr. William "Sonny" Walker of Atlanta is the moderator and Mr. Frank Martin II, historian, is the explicator. The seven distinguished panelists include Dr. Darrell Carmen, urologist, Atlanta, Georgia; Dr. Persharon M. Dixon, medical doctor/children's health, Biloxi, Mississippi; Mr. Mark Holley, executive international chef, Houston, Texas; Dr. Hieteenthia Hayes, corrections executive, Monticello, Florida; Dr. Frank McDuffie, Jr., president, Laurinburg Institute, Laurinburg, North Carolina; Mrs. LaVada Watson, executive officer, Colgate-Palmolive Company, Shanghai, China and Johannesburg, South Africa; Mr. Jim Winestock, former Senior Vice President, United Parcel Service, (UPS), Atlanta, Georgia.

Project Discovery – Commemorating The Orangeburg Massacre

Produced by ITV with ETV, **Project Discovery** is an interactive electronic field trip that allows South Carolina students to visit places and talk to experts, historians and other interesting people around our state. In February 2008 **Project Discovery** had opportunity to talk with key people and historians who gathered on the campus of South Carolina State University to commemorate The Orangeburg Massacre, as it would later be called, which occurred February 8, 1968 on the campus. While the events of that day played a part in what led to three students being killed and 27 injured, it was also the culmination of the preceding days' events that contributed to this tragic and sad time in our state's history. Please let your SC history teachers know about this special repeat that is good for middle and high school students in their study of our state and our nation's history.

Repeats Feb. 10, 11:45 a.m.–12:43 p.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)

Modjeska Monteith Simkins (1899–1992) was one of South Carolina's great women. This program paints an interesting profile of the civil rights matriarch and human rights activist who believed that the best way to make change was to vote so she made sure people knew about their voting rights and participated in elections.

- **Carolina Stories** – *A True Likeness (Richard Samuel Roberts)*
Repeats Feb. 10, 12:48–1:16 p.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)

This documentary tells the story of a little-known African American photographer from South Carolina whose posthumous discovery transcended stereotypes and brought to light a significant legacy. Richard Samuel Smalls is heralded as one of the south's most accomplished photographers of the 1920's and 30's.

- **Carolina Stories** – *The Penn Center: A Legacy of Change*
Repeats Feb. 10, 1:21–1:48 p.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)

This program tells the story of the Penn Center's inception in 1862 as a school for freed slaves to its involvement in the Gullah community today. Today the center collects, documents, preserves, and disseminates information related to cultural heritage of the Sea Island and Lowcountry African-American culture.

- **Carolina Stories** – *Saving Sandy Island*

ETV's Road Trip! Through SC Civil Rights History

Repeat block feed Feb. 3, 8:00–9:30 a.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)

Produced by ETV, these three programs focus on events, places and people who played an important role during the civil rights movement in our state from the 1940's through the early 1970's. The Civil Rights Movement has been part of an ongoing struggle since enslaved Africans were first brought to America. The modern Civil Rights Movement began in the 1940's with major events happening between 1953 and 1968. **Road Trip! Mid State** includes the home of Modjeska Simkins and a visit to historic Liberty Hill AME Church. **Road Trip! Coastal** visits the Penn Center in Beaufort County and historic Atlantic Beach. **Road Trip! Upstate** travels the roads of northern South Carolina, visiting the grounds of the old Friendship College in Rock Hill and Main Street in downtown Rock Hill where protesting college student labeled the "Friendship Nine" changed the strategy of the Civil Rights Movement nationally.

Also, check out **Road Trip! Through South Carolina Civil Rights History** online! Imagine sitting in your hi-tech hybrid vehicle outfitted with a GPS tracking system, a wireless laptop, a smart phone, and a digital camcorder. Students use these virtual instruments to "travel" back in time to learn about historical events, places and people who played an important role during the civil rights movement in South Carolina from the 1940's through the early 1970's. Embed a Video in PowerPoint

When you embed a downloaded file, you insert it right into your document much as you would a picture or clip art file. Embedding is an effective way to add video content to existing presentations, create interactive learning projects with menus and text prompts, or develop slide shows in which video files play automatically.

The procedure involved in embedding video files will vary with certain software applications. The following steps apply to documents created in Microsoft PowerPoint:

1. Download a video segment to a designated folder.
 2. Save your new or revised PowerPoint document in the same folder.
 3. Go to "Insert" > "Movies and Sounds" > "Movie from File."
 4. Click to select the video file that you wish to insert in your document.
- NOTE:** With some software versions, you may have to "Browse for File" and navigate to your saved file.
5. Select the automatic play option or choose to start the video with a mouse click.

The South Carolina Department of Education is piloting an initiative based on looping and multi-age classroom configurations and teaming (“LATTIS” – Looping Advances Teacher Teaming and Innovation in Schools). This is a no-cost way to improve academic achievement, parental involvement, student attendance, and discipline. According to SCDE’s Office of School Choice and Innovation, the early data in the pilot sites has been overwhelmingly positive. As a result, requests have been received about how to set up and manage a looping or multi-age classroom and how to become involved in the LATTIS initiative. This program was developed to meet this need.

Setting Up and Managing a Multi-age Classroom, a 54-minute ITV professional development program, is designed for educators interested in setting up and managing a looping or multi-age classroom. However, the strategies shared are useful when managing multiple levels of student needs in a traditional classroom. The two teachers featured in the program are from **Mountain View Elementary** in Greenville County. They teach students with an age span of 5–7 years, but the effective strategies they share are applicable for meeting all student needs for grades K–8. Looping or multi-age configurations create a sense of belonging and family engagement for students, teachers and parents in the educational process.

In addition to this 54-minute training program, ITV produced an overview program that will be part of the March edition of **In Our Schools** and posted online with this longer, more in-depth program. Mary Ruzga, SCDE’s Office of School Choice and Innovation, worked with ITV to coordinate content of these professional development resources that are free for SC schools by broadcast in the ITV schedule and online delivery. Also, in ITV Recertification course, participants will access online **ETV NatureScene** programs as part of their requirements and have one face-to-face meeting to share with Rudy at the end of the course.


