HORRY COUNTY TRANSPORTATION PLAN

I. OVERVIEW

The Horry County Transportation Committee, (CTC), is composed of eleven, (11), members appointed by the Horry County Legislative Delegation. The members of the CTC are appointed from and represent all sections of the county.

It is the intention of the CTC to cooperate and work closely with the appropriate Horry County engineering administrative staff, the Horry County Council, and all City Councils to improve as many roads and other transportation facilities as possible with the funds allocated.

The CTC will also cooperate with the local Area Transportation Study Committee, (Grand Strand Area Transportation Study Committee - GSATS), as it pursues its mission of prioritizing primary road needs in order to see that the primary and secondary road system of Horry County is coordinated and best serves the public.

This county wide transportation plan, as adopted by the Horry County CTC, is submitted to the South Carolina Department of Transportation (SCDOT), for its' approval in accordance with the provisions of S.C. Code §12 -27 - 400 as passed by the 1993-94 Session of the South Carolina General Assembly.

II. ADMINISTRATION

The Horry County CTC elects and requests the SCDOT to receive and administer funds that accrue to Horry County as may be directed by the CTC.

The SCOOT, through its' Road, Bridges, and Engineering Departments, will provide the following services for each project:

- (A) Design Engineering
- (B) Acquisition of Right of Way
- (C) Procurement of Construction Contracts
- (D) Projects Supervision
- (E) Compliance with minority and women owned business requirements under SC Code § 12 -27 -1320

III. PRIORITIES

The goal of the CTC will be to cooperate with the SCDOT in maintaining and resurfacing existing secondary roads in Horry County and to hard surface as many unpaved roads as practical. Consideration will be given to roads serving schools, industries and businesses, roads used for school bus routes, bridges, sidewalks, and the necessary drainage for these projects. Projects will be prioritized based upon a rating sheet prepared in cooperation with the SCDOT, Horry County Engineer's Office and after all pertinent information has been reviewed by the Horry County CTC.

IV. PROJECTS PROGRAMMED BUT NOT LET TO CONTRACT

The CTC is in the process of reviewing all projects listed by the CTC in this category. Projects funded and approved prior to July 1, 1993, are hereby approved and should be advanced to completion as programmed. Projects funded and approved after July 1, 1993, will be considered for implementation and prioritization with all other projects by the CTC.

V. PRIORITIZING PROJECTS

The CTC will use information from the SCDOT, the Horry County Engineering Office, and from the municipalities concerning the condition of secondary roads and bridges within the State System. The CTC, with the Horry County Council and the Horry County Engineer, will rate and evaluate all local roads not within the State system and will solicit recommendations and input from local officials and citizens.

VI. EQUAL CONSIDERATION

A goal of the CTC is to meet the transportation needs of the entire county, including municipalities. Consideration will be given to the distribution of projects among the council districts and including the municipalities within Horry County. CTC will not utilize an allocation or quota system among districts because of the necessity of considering such factors as population, traffic counts, environmental impact, right of way acquisition, number of households served, and similar considerations.

VII. RESURFACE AND REPAIR

The CTC will allocate such funds as it deems appropriate on an annual basis for resurfacing, repair, and upkeep of existing secondary roads and bridges, Horry County's goal is to designate 25% of funds available for this purpose, however, the CTC reserves the right to select all roads and/ or bridges approved.

VIII. REVISIONS TO PLAN

The CTC will, from time to time, review and revise the Horry County Transportation Plan, make changes, additions, or deletions which will be forwarded to SCDOT for approval.

IX. GOAL

The Horry County Transportation Committee's goal will be to provide the citizens of Horry County with the best and safest roads, bridges, and sidewalks as possible for which we are responsible.

X. PROJECTS NOT SUPERVISED BY SCOOT

In the event that the Horry County CTC expends funds on projects not subject to supervision by the SCDOT, the CTC agrees to provide an annual report detailing its' compliance with the 10% set aside program for minority business enterprises.
