This special highlights **Marrington Middle School of the Arts** and **Hilton Head Island Elementary School for the Creative Arts**. Marrington Middle School of the Arts, part of Berkeley County Schools and located in Goose Creek, was recently honored as a National Blue Ribbon School. Selected by the U.S. Department of Education, National Blue Ribbon Schools are models of excellence that other schools can emulate. Winners are either academically superior or demonstrate dramatic gains in student achievement. **Marrington Middle, Hammond Hill Elementary, Forestbrook Elementary, Oak Grove Elementary, and South Kilbourne Elementary**, all nominated by the SC Department of Education for this prestigious award, were recently named National Blue Ribbon Schools for 2012. Congratulations to students, parents, school staff, teachers, administrators, and community partners!

Hilton Head Island Elementary School for the Creative Arts (HHIESCA) is a Title I school in Beaufort County. HHIESCA implements the study of the South Carolina Academic Standards using an arts-infused approach to curriculum planning and instruction to deliver instruction in grade-level classrooms and other subject areas. All students participate in weekly classes in Visual Art, Music, Dance, Theatre, and Creative Writing. The school is a South Carolina Department of Education Distinguished Arts Program Grant recipient and has been an Arts in Basic Curriculum Project School since 2004. The John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts presented HHIESCA with the National Schools of Distinction in Arts Education Award for the 2009-2010 school year. Since 2007, the school has been a South Carolina Department of Education Palmetto Silver Award recipient.

The CWEFT programs use 21st century technology to enrich the teaching of history and social studies. The field trips are correlated to national standards and provide a compelling learning experience for grades 4–8, using re-enactors to play the roles of historical figures. **Please see rights listed below.**

Talk to your PTO about sponsoring! SC schools can receive all seven programs for around \$500. Though schools may view FREE and record programs with 10-day fair use rights (see rights below), there are advantages to paying the fee to Colonial Williamsburg to participate: schools get teacher materials, get to keep the recorded program for the life of the tape/DVD and have access to the re-enactors/historians online and via a toll-free number. - Oct. 11, 2012 ***The Will of the People*** – One of the most bitter presidential campaigns in U.S. History is part of a surprising lesson for a 21st-century student. Thomas Jefferson explains how negative campaigning, partisan politics and contested elections have been part of our political system since the earliest days of the republic.

This important program that aired for the first time in September answers many of the frequently asked questions concerning the 2012 Social Studies Support Document and statewide assessments. Presented by Lewis Huffman, Education Associate in SCDE's Office of Teacher Effectiveness, and Leslie Skinner, Ph.D., NBCT, Education Associate in SCDE's Office of Assessment, this program is important for all administrators and teachers. Although assessments are only given in grades 3–8 and U.S. History in high school, the Support Document is designed for grades K–12.

The discussion in **A Conversation about the 2012 Social Studies Support Document and Assessment** covers the purpose of the SC Social Student Academic Standards, the revised organization, how the 2011 Social Studies Standards are assessed, what the EOCEP is and who takes it, the purpose of the Support Document and how it should be used, explanation of the "Essential" and "Non-Essential" section of the Support Document, how to locate resources on teaching standards and preparing for assessments, and more. eMedia Programs Address Bullying & Cyber Safety

Please alert your school counselors to these programs and series that are FREE through eMedia and ETV. These can be a great resource for your professionals in helping teach students and teachers to recognize, talk about and prevent bullying as well as promote positive behavior and cyber safety. Also, be sure to check out other resources in addition to these that you can access in *StreamlineSC*!

- Please make sure **guidance counselors** know about these programs provided by eMedia
- **Access programs with LIMITED rights online in *StreamlineSC*. Due to LIMITED rights, eMedia cannot repeat these again until February 2013**

(NEW) Me and My 500 Friends: Staying Safe on Social Networks (LIMITED rights)

Recommended for grades 5–12, this program provides important, easy-to-follow rules for keeping information—and oneself—safe while using social networks. Experts provide very important information in this primer for social networking.

(NEW) Power Trip: Bullying in Schools (LIMITED rights)

Recommended for grades 5–10, this program explores middle school bullying from different perspectives that students will relate to and easily understand. Students hear from real teens who experienced bullying first hand as well as from students who have been the aggressors.

(NEW) You're Mean! When Words Hurt Us (LIMITED rights)

Recommended for grades 2–7, this age-appropriate program helps children understand that words can hurt—whether the insults are intentional or the inadvertent result of "trying to be funny." Each vignette includes a positive outcome where children find a way to stand up for themselves and overcome the power of hurtful words.

Wise Owl Bully Stopper (LIMITED rights)

Recommended for grades K–3, these three live-action videos are hosted by a likeable cartoon character, Wise Owl, who encourages young viewers to learn more about what bullying is and how it can be stopped. Helpful vignettes play out common situations that appeal to young viewers and ask them to think about what they would do in each situation. Programs about 15 minutes each in duration.

Bullying and Cyber Safety (HRM) (LIMITED rights)

Recommended for grades 5–12, these three programs each address an important topic for today's youth: texting, Internet safety and bullying situations. *B Careful when U Txt* gives students a primer on the Do's and Don'ts of text messaging. *Think Before You Click* provides smart online strategies to stay safe and *Bully Bystanders* sets the tone for refusing to accept hostile behavior, offering effective ways to deal with bullying. Each program is between 20 to 25 minutes in duration.

Becoming a Better Me (LIMITED rights)

Designed for K–5 students, this series features animation, live-action segments and dramatic vignettes that convey the effective strategies on a level young students can understand. *Are You a Bully?* (Lesson 4), *Don't Stand By* (Lesson 5), *Five Ways to Stop A Bully* (Lesson 6), *Help! I'm a Bully* (Lesson 7)

Connect With Kids At-Risk (LIMITED rights)

This series for grades 6–12 features kids talking to kids about at-risk issues they face and focuses on the causes of the behaviors. The peer-to-peer style has proven to change attitudes and behaviors. *Bullycide & Verbal Abuse* (Lesson 4), *Cyberstalking & Bullying* (Lesson 5), *Stopping Verbal Bullying* (Lesson 6)

XPress: Safety for Students – Lesson 1, *Cyber Safety*

Repeats Oct. 1, 8:00–8:27 a.m. IMC (Unlimited rights) Also available in *StreamlineSC*

This program, recommended for grades 6–12, features teens who were part of the SC Department of Education’s Office of Youth Services Youth Advisory Board. The middle and high school students joined Dr. Glen Walter to talk about the important issue of cyber safety. This program can serve as a good discussion “starter” on this important issue.

Wexford Series

Repeat block feed Oct. 2, 8:00–10:15 a.m. IMC (Unlimited rights) Also available in *StreamlineSC*

This series of five lessons, designed for students in grades 6–10, explores abuse in teenage relationships, bullying, peer pressure, anger and alternatives to aggression and violence, criticism, and striving for perfection. Problems are resolved in a positive manner, ultimately finding workable solutions that are realistic. Each lesson is approximately 23 minutes in duration.

Slim Goodbody’s Daily Almanac – Try it! You’ll Like it!

Jump start the school day with **Slim Goodbody’s Daily Almanac**. This fact-filled, educational series hosted by Slim Goodbody will engage students and support teaching objectives in social studies, language arts, health, science, math, civics, and character education.

Recommended for grades K–5 and great to use in your school news programs! Each program is loaded with high-interest information presented in a lively format combining music, archival visuals, artwork, photos, and animation. Please let your elementary teachers know about this series! Programs for 2013 will be announced in December.

There is a separate five-minute program for every day. Each daily program contains five unique segments:

- This Day in History (Social Studies)
- Word of the Day (Language Arts)
- Extremes (Science)
- Health Tips (Health)
- We the People (Civics and Character) or Earth Alert (Environment)

Red Ribbon Drug Week October 22–26

Elementary Level Recommendations:

- * **Tick Tock Minutes (SL)** – Block feed of entire series Oct. 22, 8:00–8:50 a.m. (Unlimited rights)
Designed for grades PK–2. The first 15 lessons in this series of 35 lessons focus on health and safety. Lesson 7 is *Drugs...No Way*.
- * **Life Skills 101 (SL)** – Block feed of entire series Oct. 22, 10:00–10:57 a.m. (Unlimited broadcast/off-air record – no tape duplication)
Designed for grades 2–3. Lesson 3 in this series, *Problems and Choices*, focuses on life skill development for young students.
- * **Just for Me** – Lesson 6 airs Oct. 22, 11:02–11:17 a.m. (Unlimited rights)
Designed for grades 2–4. Lesson 6 in this series, *I Don't Buy It*, shows how the media may influence a child's personal health behavior.
- * **Straight Up!** – Block feed of entire series Oct. 22, 1:00 p.m.–2:54 p.m. (Unlimited rights)
Designed for grades 4–6. These six lessons tell the story of a boy who wants to be accepted by his friends who are tempting him to try drugs and alcohol. Hosted by Lou Gossett, Jr.

Middle/High School Level Recommendations:

- * **Think Twice (SL)** – This lesson airs Oct. 23, 8:00–8:23 a.m. (Unlimited rights)
Designed for grades 6–12. This realistic program introduces youth to three teenagers who are actually incarcerated in South Carolina's juvenile prisons. These teens offer striking depictions of their loss of freedom, while reliving the events and choices that brought them to life behind bars. Their message: Things may have been different for them had they taken the time to "think twice."
- * **Open Lines** – Lesson 7 airs Oct. 23, 8:30–9:27 a.m. (Unlimited rights)
Designed for grades 7–12. Lesson 7 in this series, the *Teen Survival Week* program, features teens from around the state talking about diverse subjects such as school safety, dating, dress codes, and the environment. Dr. Glen Walter, an educator and psychologist, hosts the program with teens.
- * **Talking It Over: Teen Issues (SL)** – Lesson 2 airs Oct. 23, 9:33–10:05 a.m. (Unlimited rights)
Designed for grades 7–12. Lesson 2, *Drug Abuse*, provides valuable conversations with a counselor and students on key health and social topics such as drug abuse.
- * **Teen Survival Programs (SL)** – Block feed Oct 23, 10:10 a.m.–1:44 p.m. (Lessons 1–5), October 24, 8:00 a.m.–1:15 p.m. (Lessons 6–11), October 25, 8:00–10:05 a.m. (Lessons 12–13) (Unlimited rights)
Designed for grades 9–12. **Keep It Real; Grave Decisions; SC Youth Gang Documentary; MCTFT: Kids, Drugs, Crime and Consequences; Teens and Booze; DLNETS: College 101: Depression and Suicide; and seven DLNETS: Peers Influence Peers** programs show the harsh realities of risk-taking behaviors such as not wearing seat belts, speeding, drinking and driving, and gang life. **MCTFT: Kids, Drugs, Crime, And Consequences** has three parts for grades 4–8 also. **NOTE:** Teachers should preview before use.

Designed for grades 4–12. The realities of methamphetamine abuse hit home in this moving program about a teen boy's life turned upside down by his mother's addiction. **NOTE:** Teachers should preview before use.

Repeat – New Fads in Teen Alcohol Use

Repeats Oct. 10, 1:00–1:59 p.m. IMC (Unlimited rights) Also in *StreamlineSC*

This program, designed for educators and parents, was coordinated by Kimberly W. Smith, formerly with SCDE Safe and Drug-Free Schools, and presented by Kristy A. Stoneburner, MPH, CHES, CPP. Ms. Stoneburner is Program Coordinator for Lexington One Community Coalition (LOCC). *PEEL it! Spark it! Spyke it!* This presentation explores new trends in underage alcohol use. Current information on teen alcohol use is presented, along with a review of emerging products. The program examines the advertisers' role in marketing alcoholic beverages to youth to enable understanding of the scope of underage drinking both locally and nationally, examine the role of the environment on underage alcohol use and identify new trends in underage alcohol use.

The Battle of Eutaw Springs in South Carolina in September 1781 was the last engagement in the Revolutionary War that took place in the Carolinas. This short segment, produced by eMedia and ETV, gives the highlights of this story telling why this was such an important battle in our state’s and nation’s history.

Creating a Career with the Media Arts in Mind (NEW)

Grades 6–12 5 lessons 27 minutes Career Guidance/Arts

Grades 5–12 5 lessons 15–20 minutes Economics

The NEW title for the ETV Stock Market Game is **Making Dollars From \$ense!** These five programs will give students information they need to make thoughtful, well-informed decisions about earning, saving, spending, and investing money. Also, each program will feature one of the 2013 SC Young Entrepreneur Award winners who share their experience of working for themselves to earn money. This series is produced by eMedia and ETV, working with the SC Economics. The NEW programs start October 5 and continue October 19, November 2, 16, and 30, at 8:30 a.m. and repeat at 9:00 a.m. Also, they repeat at 9:30 a.m. the following Monday on the K–12 IMC. Fairfax Network – Mount Vernon Series (NEW)

Grades 3–12 4 lessons 45–87 minutes Social Studies

These programs are provided by the Fairfax Network and produced in cooperation with Mount Vernon. They were provided in the eMedia schedule when they aired, but since they have unlimited rights for SC schools, we will repeat them for access. Programs include: *Hear My Story: The Enslaved Community at Mt. Vernon* (May 2012), *I Ain’t No Three Fifths of a Person: Slavery and The Constitution* (March 2012), *Funding a Nation: Washington, Jefferson and Hamilton* (Oct. 2011), and *Fractured Union* (2010, repeated Sept. 2011).

Complete History of United States Wars 1700–2004 (NEW)

(LIMITED rights–airs in SPLASH Weeks)

Grades 7–12 8 lessons 56 minutes Social Studies

War has always been part of the American experience. From the time the first colonists set foot upon North America’s shores, they were in conflict with the Native inhabitants. One hundred years later the colonies found themselves an extension of the conflicts in Europe. Less than a century later, the Revolutionary War freed the fledgling United States from the British. America grew in strength and power until at the beginning of the 21st century it was the foremost military power in the world. These programs, hosted by George Kennedy, tell this 300-year saga.

Me and My 500 Friends: Staying Safe on Social Networks (NEW)

(LIMITED rights—airs in SPLASH Weeks)

Grades 5–12 1 lesson 20 minutes Character Education/Safety

This program provides important, easy-to-follow rules for keeping information—and oneself—safe while using social networks. Pre-teens and teens learn that social networks such as Facebook can be a useful tool for communication and connection, but also pose significant risks. Experts discuss how harmful rumors can be spread quickly as well as the danger of cyberbullying or harassment that can occur through the internet, cell phones and other technology. The risks of posting sexually explicit images or materials online and encountering predators are emphasized. Viewers see how “phishers” and identity thieves can glean private information from what you post on social profiles in this primer for social networking.

Meet the Author – Discovering Shakespeare (aired May 2012)

Grades 9–12 1 lesson 30 minutes English Language Arts

Four centuries after he wrote them, the plays and poetry of William Shakespeare endure as a source of entertainment and fascination. The Fairfax Network returns to the Folger Shakespeare Library in Washington, D.C., to examine one of Shakespeare’s most evil characters, Richard III—a character audiences love to hate. Folger Director Dr. Michael Witmore discusses how a play written over 400 years ago still resonates with today’s audience as we analyze key Shakespeare passages that underscore issues of power and deception.

Palmetto Heritage (NEW)

Grades 3–12 11 lessons* 11–21 minutes Social Studies

These programs have been created using the dramatizations produced as part of *The Palmetto Special* series. Events, people and places that shaped our state’s history are shared through updated introduction segments with young hosts interwoven with re-purposed dramatizations that tell many of South Carolina’s important stories. Produced by eMedia and ETV, these can be used as a resource in the study of South Carolina history on middle and high school grade levels. Some segments can also support elementary-grade level social studies curriculum. Titles include: *Denmark Vesey*, *Burning of Columbia*, *Charleston Tea Party*, and *Legend of Isaqueena*. *Additional lessons are being completed and will be added to series.

Power Trip: Bullying in Schools (NEW)

(LIMITED rights – will air in SPLASH Weeks)

Grades 5–10 1 lesson 29 minutes Character Education/Safety

This program explores middle school bullying from different perspectives that students will relate to and easily understand. Students hear from real teens who experienced bullying first hand as well as from students who have been the aggressors. Special attention is focused on understanding the different kinds of bullying and the differences between how girls and boys bully. Cheryl Dellasega, author of "Surviving Ophelia," describes relational aggression which is typical of how girls bully and Dr. Michael R. Carpenter, a bullying prevention trainer, coaches young teens on how to modify behaviors to achieve peaceful outcomes. Other topics include how bullied kids can "stand up, step up and speak out" to stop bullying.

Project Discovery – Honoring the Role of SC Veterans in Our History (NEW)

Grades 3–12 1 lesson 57 minutes Social Studies

Presented from the SC State Museum, this program produced by eMedia and ETV highlights famous and little known heroes as we discover how our state has played a significant role in our nation’s military history from the time of the Revolutionary War through present day. Lewis Huffman, Social Studies at SCDE, cohosts with special guests Tom Falvey, SC State Museum; Joe Long, SC Confederate Relic Room and Military Museum; Kevin Shwedo, Retired U.S. Army; plus a message from Superintendent of Education Mick Zais. Program includes information on Battle of Eutaw Springs 1781, museum’s Civil War Exhibit, SC native WWI airship pilot, and Camp Jackson. **(NOTE: This program aired initially Nov. 10, 2011)**

SC Hall of Fame Shorts (NEW)

Grades 3–12 2 lessons* 10–32 minutes Social Studies /Character Ed

These programs have been produced as part of ETV’s SC Hall of Fame project. They consist of short segments on inductees. The first program highlights our state’s native-son astronauts who were inducted into the South Carolina Hall of Fame: Col. Charles M. Duke, Jr., Ronald Erwin McNair and Maj. Gen. Charles F. Bolden, Jr. The other program features two South Carolinians, both with roots in Saluda County, who fought at the Alamo. (*More programs will be added to this series as they are completed during the year.)

Short Takes with Naturalist Rudy Mancke (NEW)

Grades 3–12 10 lessons 1–2 minutes Science

These short segments with Naturalist Rudy Mancke provide engaging and interesting information on fossils, shells and creatures! From seeing the exoskeleton of a horseshoe crab to the skull of our state reptile, from checking out what sponges are to examining our state shell, students learn a lot while sharing a special visit to Mancke's office at USC. Titles include: *Loggerhead Sea Turtle, Horseshoe Crab, Bivalves and Univalves, Brown Pelican, Sponge, and Moon Snail*. Produced by eMedia and ETV. See flyer page 25.

Stash That Cash: Budgeting, Saving and Investing for Teens (NEW)

(LIMITED rights – will air in SPLASH Weeks)

Grades 7–12 1 lesson 22 minutes Financial Literacy

This program introduces the concepts of money management and financial planning for the future in a fun, easy-to-understand manner. Experts coach students on how to budget for expenses, set and attain savings goals, and choose the best ways to save and invest their money. Students learn how to make monthly budgets, how to estimate expenses, how to balance a checkbook, how internet banking works, how credit cards work, how to avoid credit traps, and how to protect themselves from identity theft. Humorous vignettes and solid advice help students learn the basics about how to spend smart, save and invest for the future.

Welcome to My Career (NEW)

Grades 6–12 1 lesson 16 minutes Career Guidance

This program takes students to Hollywood, California to visit with Billy Brooks, who is a Senior Lighter in animation at fabulous DreamWorks, the home of *Kung Fu Panda, Shrek* and *Puss in Boots*. Mr. Brooks will take South Carolina students on a journey behind the scenes of the DreamWorks "campus" where you'll learn about the fascinating 21st century work environment and what a career in animation is like in a highly creative setting with cutting edge technology. Students will learn how co-founder Steven Spielberg developed a work place that fosters creativity. And, video game-obsessed students can set their sights on "careers in animation."

You're Mean! When Words Hurt Us (NEW)

(LIMITED rights – will air in SPLASH Weeks)

Grades 2–7 1 lesson 13 minutes Character Education/Safety

This age-appropriate program helps children understand that words can hurt—whether the insults are intentional or the inadvertent result of "trying to be funny." Four common school and home vignettes identify the power of words: a know-it-all who tries to boss others, a playground bully who picks on others, a teacher's pet who relishes seeing other students make mistakes, and an older sibling whose sarcastic banter distresses her little brother. Each vignette includes a positive outcome where children find a way to stand up for themselves and overcome the power of hurtful words. Techniques include: Stand Up for Yourself, Ignore the Bully, Explain How the Words Make You Feel, and Seek Help From an Adult.

Added Lessons (Revised) for eMedia Schedule 2012–13

Take on the South*

Grades 9–12 8 lessons 60 minutes Social Studies/ELA

This series of debates produced by ETV for USC's Institute of Southern Studies (ISS) is hosted by Dr. Walter Edgar. Each program features a debate between distinguished guest experts on historical or current issues related to the South. Titles include: *What Was the Most Influential 20th Century Southern Novel?* and *Would Southern Slavery Have Survived the Civil War?* (*NOTE: This series was added 2010–11 with only two programs and were not aired except in preview schedule.)

Tune Up to Literacy*

Grades Pre-K–3 7 lessons 1–3 minutes English Language Arts/Literacy

This series, produced by eMedia and ETV, encourages literacy using original songs by composer/lyricist and educator Dr. Al Balkin, former Western Michigan Professor and composer who wrote the music for America's first production of *The Hobbit* as well as several off-Broadway children's musicals. The fast-paced, short programs musically introduce and reinforce crucial literacy concepts such as using the period, punctuation and sentence construction with songs entitled "Get the Point," "Punctuation Mystery," "A Syllable," "The Adjective Song," and "What's a Consonant, What's a Vowel?" A Literary Tour of South Carolina*

Grades 5–12 37 lessons 11–50 minutes English Language Arts

In this series that has eleven new authors (27–37) students meet nationally recognized authors who call South Carolina home. As they learn about the writing process, students hear what the author has to say about making characters come to life, learn how to create plot and track action as well as find out how important research is to any story, fiction or non-fiction. This series has been produced by eMedia and ETV.

(*NOTE: Programs 27–37 added this year.)

Riverbanks Roundup*

Grades K–6 14 lessons 27 minutes Science/Social Studies

This series, produced by eMedia, highlights the educational aspects of the many wonderful animals and plants at the Riverbanks Zoo and Garden. Content is designed to support South Carolina Science Academic Standards in grades K-6 such as Characteristics of Organisms, Animals, Habitats, Adaptations, Organisms and their Environments, and Ecosystems. Conservation messages are shared on how we can appreciate and take better care of our world and the animals we share it with across the planet. (*NOTE: Lessons 12–14 have been added and more will be added during this school year.)

IdellaBodie's SC Women*

Grades 3–12 11 lessons 25–50 minutes Social Studies

These stories, based on IdellaBodie's book *South Carolina Women*, have been produced over the last few years with permission of the author by eMedia and SCETV. 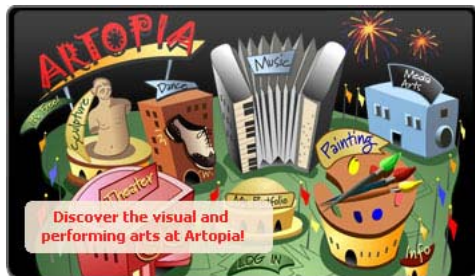

Tune Up to Literacy – Five NEW Song Programs Added

This series is “the song way to learning language.” With original songs created by composer, lyricist and educator Dr. Al Balkin, former Western Michigan Professor and composer who wrote the music for America’s first production of *The Hobbit* as well as several off-Broadway children’s musicals, the short programs are recommended for students in grades pre-K through 3.

The fast-paced, short programs, each between one and three minutes, musically introduce and reinforce crucial literacy concepts such as using the period, punctuation and sentence construction.

Special thanks to Dr. Balkin for providing his songs for South Carolina schools and allowing eMedia with ETV to develop video to go with his music to create these fun programs that encourage literacy!

(NOTE: This series was started in production in 2010 and two programs have been available. Programs 3-7 have been added for 2012–13 and others will be added during the year. Other new programs will be announced in the *eMedia Update*.)

1. Get the Point (duration 1:22)

Without the number one punctuation mark – the period – words would run together like scrambled eggs and make no sense. This calypso song celebrates the period’s existence. Children will learn its primary function and through constant pun on “point,” what it looks like!

2. Punctuation Mystery (duration 1:45)

This song acknowledges the difficulties of comprehensive punctuation, declares awareness of the problem and an inclination to solve it! Framed musically around a tango, a dance from Argentina, the song includes commas, colons, semi-colons, and apostrophes ... just to name a few!

3. A Syllable (duration 1:11)

Understanding the concept of a syllable is the open sesame to sounding out almost any written word. Developing this ability allows a child to move into the world of reading. This song defines the concept to peak interest!

4. What’s a Consonant, What’s a Vowel? (duration 1:25)

A consonant can be almost any letter you see except an A, or an I, or an O or a U, or an E. Those are the vowels that consonants keep company. This message is presented in the musical setting of an Irish jig.

5. Sing a Simple Rhyme (duration 2:10)

This song will fundamentally improve the ways that children attend to sound patterns in words. Wordplay and word associations invite children to provide words that rhyme. This song offers instruction on what a rhyme is and then gives directed practice in identifying a potential rhyming word ending and listening to words that rhyme with that ending.

6. The Adjective Song (duration 1:38)

This song has a Middle Eastern musical style, clearly stating the concept “An adjective is a word that describes a noun.” It then elaborates on how descriptions might include such characteristics as color, shape, size, age, smell, taste, feel, attitude, worth, and more!

7. Signs (duration 1:28)

It’s important to pay attention to the signs around us everywhere that sometimes are there to keep us safe and safely moving in our fast-paced, often crowded world! This song encourages students to be able to read and pay attention to the signs all around them.

- **Forgotten Founder: The Story of Charles Pinckney**

This program in the **Carolina Stories** series premiered on ETV September 17, 2010. **Carolina Stories: Forgotten Founder** is a historical visualization of the biography of Charles Pinckney, a South Carolinian whose contributions to the birth of our nation and state are largely unknown until now. His career of public service began in 1779 when at the age of 21 he became a member of the SC General Assembly. Then Pinckney was selected as a delegate to Congress four years later and became one of four representatives from SC at the Constitutional Convention. Throughout his active political career he served four terms as our Governor, in the U.S. House and the Senate, and appointed as the U.S. Ambassador to Spain.

Through the research of several historians, this documentary explores Pinckney’s work as a public servant and his contributions to the United States Constitution while examining the reasons why his story is all but removed from American history. This program is a good one to keep for use next year for Constitution studies around September 17, the anniversary date of the signing in 1787.

This special program is directed by ETV’s Sanford Adams with original artwork by James. H. Palmer, Jr., and was funded in part by the Friends of Historic Snee Farm and Humanities Council of SC. It was used as part of this year’s celebration for Constitution Week at the National Park Service Charles Pinckney National Historic Site in Mt. Pleasant, SC. 8 – Sea Urchin (duration 1:24)

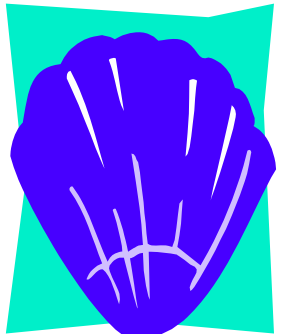
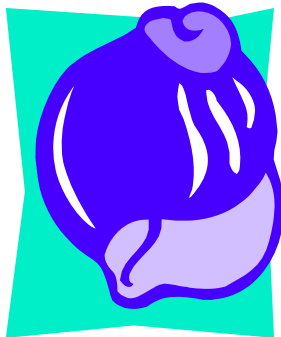
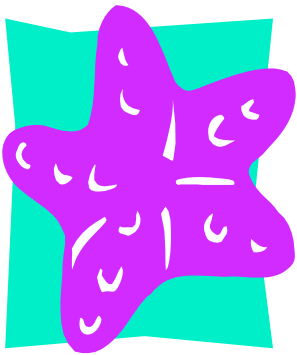

The project was a partnership with the SC State Library and the State Museum to kick off Summer Reading programs across the state. Jennifer Brown, SDE literacy specialist who hosts “Literacy Matters” interviewed each of the keynote presenters. Both keynote presenters are award winning children’s authors and illustrators. Denise Fleming’s books include *In the Small, Small Pond*; *The Cow Who Clucked* and *Buster Goes to Cowboy Camp*. Marc Brown is the creator, author/illustrator of over 30 Arthur books.

The Literacy and Early Learning Unit in the Office of Teacher Effectiveness is researching Summer Reading Loss. Books were provided for over 15,000 students in thirty-two schools in an effort to ameliorate summer reading loss. Twelve schools administering Measurement of Academic Progress (MAP) to first through fourth grade students in spring and fall make up the formal research conducted by South Carolina Educational Policy Center (SCEPC) and the Office of Program Evaluation (OPE) in the College of Education at USC. Five additional schools, which do not use MAP in the required grades, are also part of the informal study. Data will be collected using other assessments.

This project is in response to SC Reading First program evaluations which indicated significant summer loss in most students over an extended period of time and is an attempt to reduce summer reading loss by providing access to books for students to read during the summer. In addition, research conducted by Dr. Richard Allington found the outcomes on a state reading assessment, FCAT, indicated a statistically significant effect for providing access to books for summer reading.
