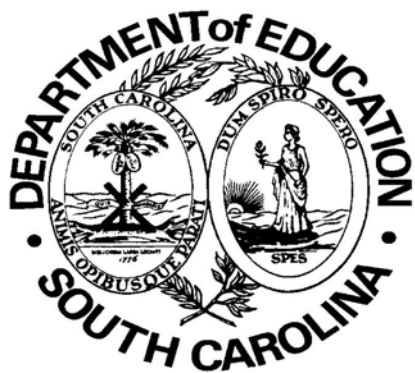

## INTRODUCTION

Since 1971, the South Carolina Department of Education has collected and analyzed data on school dropouts. The *Report on Student Dropout and Completion Rates* provides an assessment of the progress made by state and local school districts in their effort to reduce the number of school dropouts and increase the graduation rate.

The annual data collection process employed in South Carolina reports students who leave school during a twelve-month period, including those who leave over the summer. The process allows those who reenroll during the collection period and remain in school to be excluded from the count.

The 2001–02 dropout report consists of ten tables. Table 1 contains a comparison of the total number of dropouts with the total enrollment in grades nine through twelve. This comparison, called an “event rate,” shows the proportion of students who drop out in one year. The resulting percentage may be compared yearly as an indicator of progress. Tables 2 through 9 compare the number of dropouts with enrollment by ethnicity and gender categories in grades nine through twelve.

Table 10 contains a completion rate statistic that has been used to estimate the graduation rate of high school students. This index reports the number of students enrolled in the twelfth grade as compared to the number of students in the eighth grade five years earlier. The completers report may underestimate the number of completers because many students obtain General Educational Development diplomas (GEDs), receive high school diplomas through adult education, or take more or less than the standard amount of time to graduate. The data in table 10 also do not take into account the number of students who moved either into or out of a particular district during the five-year time period.

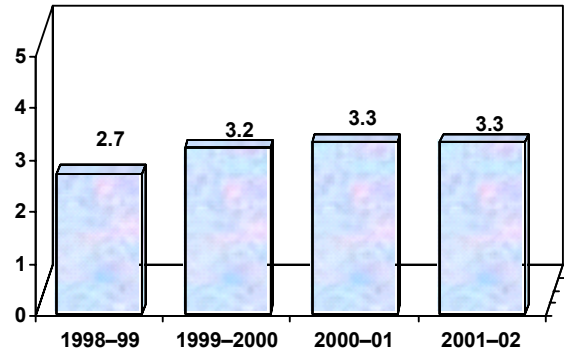
## ADULT EDUCATION

In 2001–02, more than 25,000 students between the ages of seventeen and twenty-one were enrolled in adult education programs. In addition, in 2001, 24 percent of all students receiving their high school diplomas completed their requirements through the South Carolina Adult High School diploma program. Also in 2001, 4,402 students between the ages of seventeen and twenty-one earned General Educational Development diplomas (GEDs).

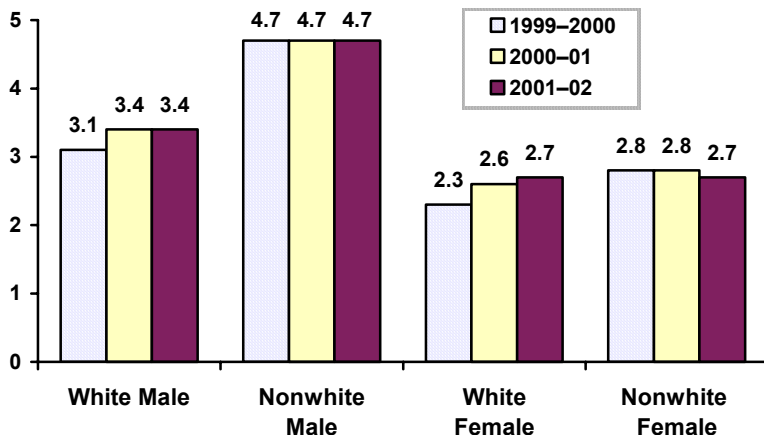
## DATA HIGHLIGHTS

### DROPOUT RATE FOR GRADES 9–12

- From 2000–01 to 2001–02, the dropout rate for grades 9 through 12 declined in 44 of the 85 districts.
- The dropout rate remained constant at 3.3 percent during the 2000–01 and 2001–02 academic years.



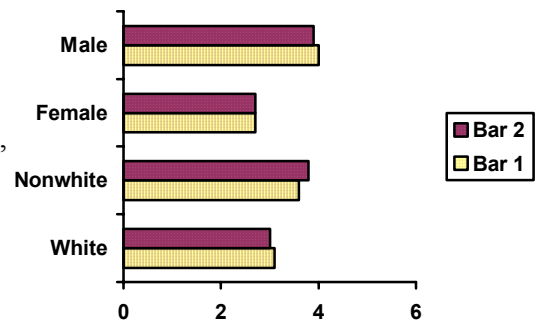
### DROPOUT PRECENTAGES BY ETHNICITY AND GENDER



- From 2000–01 to 2001–02, the dropout rate for nonwhite males and white males remained the same.
- Nonwhite males continue to drop out at the highest rate.

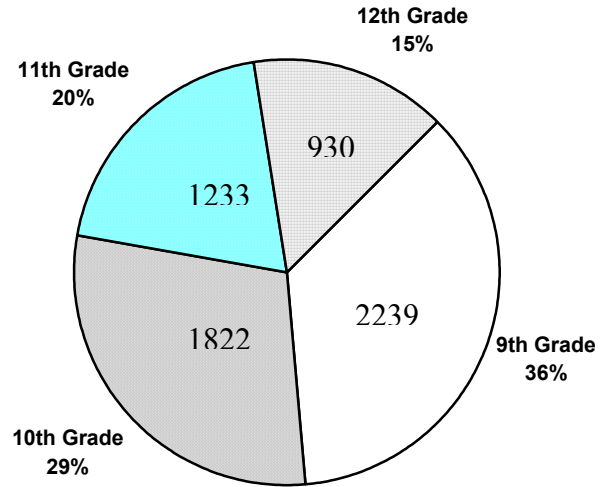
### DROPOUTS BY ETHNICITY AND GENDER

- In 2001–02, males dropped out at a rate of 4.0 percent, compared to 2.7 percent for females.
- In 2001–02, the dropout rate for nonwhites was 3.6 percent, compared to 3.1 percent for whites.

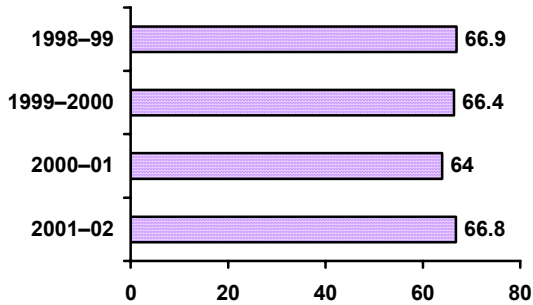


## DROPOUTS BY GRADE 2001-02

- Approximately 36 percent of all dropouts occurred in the ninth grade.
- Cumulatively, 65 percent of the dropouts had occurred by the tenth grade.



## COMPLETION RATE\* Eighth Graders Compared to High School Completers



- Approximately 70 percent of eighth graders completed high school.
- The completion rate has remained constant over the past several years.

## GLOSSARY

**average daily membership.** The aggregate number of days for which students are enrolled in school divided by the number of days in the reporting period. The average daily membership (ADM) is computed for all public schools and districts at the end of 45 days and 135 days of school. The latter count is considered official for funding purposes.

**completion rate.** The number of high school completers divided by the eighth-grade average daily membership five years earlier.

**dropout.** A student who leaves school for any reason, other than death, before graduation or completion of a program of studies and without transferring to another school or institution.

**dropout collection cycle.** A twelve-month collection cycle that begins the first day of school and ends the day before the first day of school the following year.

**dropout (event) rate.** The proportion of students who, during a single year, leave high school without completion of a program of studies and without transferring to another school or institution.

**enrollment, 180 days.** The cumulative 35-day enrollment at the end of 180 days of school. A student is counted in the 35-day enrollment on the 35th day the student has been present in school, provided the student has not been counted in the 35-day enrollment of any other school in the state.

**enrollment, precode.** Student-level information reported by school districts in January of each year and updated in March.

**ethnicity.** The classification of large groups of people according to common racial, national, or cultural origin or background.

**white.** The racial/ethnic category designating a person having origins in any of the peoples of Europe, North Africa, or the Middle East.

**nonwhite.** A racial/ethnic category that includes African-Americans, Hispanics, Asian/Pacific Islanders, and American Indians.

**high school completer.** A person who has received formal recognition from school authorities, by the granting of a diploma, for completing a prescribed course of studies in a secondary level school, or who has received a certificate of attendance or other certificate of completion in lieu of a diploma.

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
